


Palm Beach Citizens Academy Created

The Palm Beach Citizens Fire Academy was created by Mark Bradshaw in the year of 2002. It was a six week course meeting once a week at station 3 designed to introduce the citizens of Palm Beach to get a better understanding on the intricate skills and training that a firefighter has to endure. The course took approximately a year to design and implement.

Responders Get High-Tech Training

Responding to a call, Palm Beach firefighters rig an intravenous line to a mannequin and administer medication. The monitor nearby, they can see the powerful drug take effect as it lowers the patient's heart rate. Along with pulse, the \$13,000 mannequin produces blood pressure and EKG readings. When pumped full of air it breathes. This in-depth, realistic training is possible, thanks to the department's new simulation lab.

Fire Department For Palm Beach

An American LaFrance fire fighting machine costing \$12,500 was ordered for immediate delivery. In view of the rapid development of Palm Beach, it was thought wise by the council not to depend any longer upon the fire fighting plant of West Palm Beach, but to put in a plant of its own

New Palm Beach Fire Station

It was announced to the public that six new recruits for the Town of Palm Beach Fire Rescue Department would open the Town's second Fire Station, Station 1, located on the north side of the Town. The station was equipped with a brand new fire engine from the American LaFrance company.

"Since the garage was sealed and the fire had so much time to burn, we're going to lose the whole structure," said Division Chief Sean Baker.



Firefighters Deployed to Surfside Search and Rescue

Palm Beach firefighters helping with the search-and-rescue efforts at the site of the condo collapse in Surfside. "Firefighters from all over South Florida deployed to the area on Thursday night. They will work with Florida Task Force No. 2. As of Friday morning, there are four deaths and at least 159 people unaccounted for. The 12-story building collapsed in the middle of the night on Thursday."
